Also, clothes, tents, blankets to 1923 people, 9 bikes from our Bike to Work Program. Our Connections Outreach Center gave 24,512 services such as meals, showers and washers & dryer. Last Christmas, the residents of Citrus County, including Crystal River Village, gave 2,172 children a wonderful Christmas!

Our concern now is summer is coming and children are out of school and will not get meals at school, putting a hardship on families already struggling. We always have more families coming to us for help in summer. To our snowbirds, if you have any food that will not survive until you return, remember us!

Please remember the Post Office Food Drive on May 12, put a bag of food on your mailbox early and our sweet mail lady will make a second trip around her route to pick it up. ## Alert Citrus

The Citrus County Sheriff's office provides a system to keep you informed in the event of weather or other emergencies, like boil water notices. It is called **Alert Citrus**. You can choose where to receive alerts; they can come to your home phone, cell phone, or email.

## Disaster Re-entry Hang Tags

We who live in Florida are in a hurricane and flood prone area, and evacuation is sometimes necessary. To protect homeowners against theft and vandalism following a mandatory evacuation, only residents are allowed back into the area during recovery. They must show proof of residency at a checkpoint for re-entry. Citrus County issues Disaster Re-entry tags to its residents to keep in their vehicles and use to help facilitate return to their homes after an evacuation.

These tags were previously distributed to CRV residents in their welcome packets when they moved in. However, due to increased security guidelines, Re-entry passes now are only available at the Sheriff's Office Emergency Operations Center in Lecanto; Sheriff's Offices in Inverness, Crystal River, and Beverly Hills; and the Tax Collector's Office in Inverness and Crystal River (Meadowcrest location). The pass should be kept in the glove compartment until needed, and then hung on the rearview mirror of your vehicle during re-entry.

The Re-entry tag for our Village is purple and marked 7W. By error, incorrect orange tags marked 5W were provided to some of our residents. If you received an orange tag, please contact one of the above locations for a purple replacement. Other proofs of residency may be accepted for re-entry, but snowbirds may not have anything (i.e. photo identification with a FL address) with them.
